The following itinerary is a sample only and may be modified in the best interest of the group Day One, Sunday Arrival

Afternoon flight to Krakow from Dublin with Ryanair (flight schedules are continually being modified and will be confirmed later). Transfer to city centre (half-hour drive). Check in at our 3-star hotel in Krakow where we will stay six nights. Tonight, we will arrive too late for dinner, but dinner with drinks will be included on all other evenings.

Day Two, Monday

TOUR OF THE OLD TOWN OF KRAKOW

Krakow is one of the oldest and most beautiful cities in central Europe. The old centre of Krakow is on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Our itinerary will take in the Royal Castle on Wawel Hill, Wawel Cathedral (tomb of St Stanislaus, patron of Poland), the Old Market Square, and St. Mary's Basilica with its unique 15th century altar carved in wood. Some free time for lunch during the tour. Dinner at the hotel.

Day Three, Tuesday THE SHRINE OF DIVINE MERCY

This morning we will visit the Divine Mercy centre in Lagiewniki and the tomb of the Apostle of Divine Mercy, St Faustina, in the old convent. St Faustina made many prophecies in her writings that have already come true. We will view some of the first depictions of the Divine Mercy image. Mass celebration. Return to our hotel. Afternoon free. Dinner in hotel.

Day Four, Wednesday BIRTHPLACE OF JOHN PAUL II, AUSCHWITZ-BIRKENAU CONCENTRATION CAMP

After breakfast we will visit Wadowice - the town where John Paul II was born. We will visit his parish church and see the baptismal font in which he was baptised. A chapel dedicated to the Polish Pontiff contains a vial of his blood. Next door is the family home of John Paul. This has now been transformed into an entertaining museum that tells the entire life story of this great saint. Mass celebration. Afternoon visit to the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial, the site of one of the largest extermination camps for European Jews. The tour by excellent local guides will include a visit to the cell where St. Maximilian Kolbe died. Tour and cost of obligatory headphones included. Return to hotel for dinner.

Day Five, Thursday

SCHINDLER'S FACTORY, JEWISH QUARTER AND GHETTO

Today we will visit some important places in the city of Krakow. We will see the Jewish Ghetto where 70,000 Jews were imprisoned during the occupation. Most of these perished in the concentration camps. Our tour will include (viewing from the outside) Schindler's Factory and the Jewish Quarter with its many synagogues and good-value restaurants. We will also see the Old University where Copernicus and St John Paul studied. Dinner at the hotel.

Day Six, Friday OPTIONAL VISIT TO SALT MINE

Today there will be an optional visit to the UNESCO World Heritage listed Salt Mine at Wieliczka near Krakow. The cost of the trip will depend on numbers availing of it. This is the only mine in the world that has been in operation continuously since the Middle Ages. During the tour, you can view underground chambers hewn out of the salt rock, statues sculpted in salt, saline lakes, as well as an underground church furnished completely in items made of salt. Return to our hotel at the centre of Krakow. Dinner.

Day Seven, Saturday

TRANSFER TO KRAKOW AIRPORT AND FLIGHT TO DUBLIN

Final day itinerary to be organized. Check-out of hotel. Transfer to Krakow airport for our flight back to Dublin (final flight times will be confirmed a few weeks before departure).
