Pilgrimage Highlights

A pilgrimage through the heart of Italy (day-to-day itinerary will be provided at a later stage)

Umbria (and environs) has an important array of pilgrimage sites and cultural treasures. Our itinerary focuses on locations that are particularly meaningful and more easily accessible for a group of this kind—intentionally avoiding some of the steeper, hillier towns. However, this itinerary is not wheelchair/electric scooter accessible and does involve a good amount of walking.

Assisi

Here we will venerate the holy place associated with St. Francis and St. Clare:

- Visit the tombs of the saints of Assisi in the **Basilicas of St. Francis and St. Clare**, home to world-renowned sacred art.
- Mass at the tomb of **Saint Carlo Acutis**, the teenage saint who has become such an inspiration for young people around the world.
- Eight centuries ago, St Francis died at the **Porziuncola**, the humble chapel where the Franciscan movement began located inside the **Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels**.

Cascia

Discover the life and legacy of **St. Rita**, a woman of deep faith who journeyed from wife and mother to Augustinian nun. Her **shrine and monastery** remain one of central Italy's most visited pilgrimage sites.

Spoleto

This ancient town has extensive pre-Christian and medieval remains:

- The central square has an ancient Roman road and arch.
- Mass in the magnificent **Cathedral of Spoleto**, adorned with frescoes by Renaissance master **Filippo Lippi**.

Orvieto

The beautiful Duomo houses the Eucharistic miracle that prompted the introduction of the feast of Corpus Christi.

Greccio

St Francis began the tradition of the Christmas crib in this Umbrian hamlet

Rome by Night

The most effective way to get an overview of the Eternal City:

• A panoramic night tour featuring the Colosseum, Vatican City, St. Peter's Basilica, Tiber Island, the Palatine and Aventine Hills, the historic Jewish Ghetto, St. Mary Major, St. John Lateran, the Holy Stairs, and more.

St. Peter's Basilica

Built over the bones of St Peter, this awe-inspiring structure holds the tombs of St. John Paul II, Pope Leo the Great and other popes. Masterpieces of art include the *Pietà* by Michelangelo.
