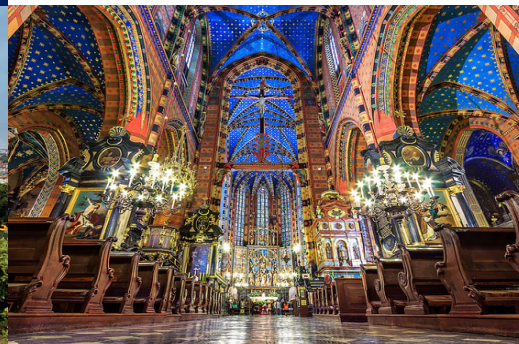

The following itinerary is a sample only and may be modified in the best interest of the group

Day One, Saturday

Arrival, St Florian's

Morning flight to Krakow from Dublin with Ryanair (flight schedules are often modified and will be confirmed later). Transfer to city centre (30 min drive). Check in at our 3-star hotel in Krakow where we will stay six nights. The afternoon programme will be finalised later and will include Mass in the parish church of St Florian where the young John Paul served as a priest. Dinner at the hotel.

Day Two, Sunday

IMPORTANT SIGHTS IN THE OLD TOWN OF KRAKOW

Krakow is one of the oldest and most beautiful cities in central Europe. The old centre of Krakow is on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Our itinerary will take in the Royal Castle on Wawel Hill, Wawel Cathedral (tomb of St Stanislaus, patron of Poland, crypt of St Leonard where John Paul celebrated his first Mass), the Old Market Square, and St. Mary's Basilica (including Mass celebration) with its unique 15th century altar carved in wood. Some free time for lunch during the tour. Dinner at the hotel.

Day Three, Monday

THE SHRINE OF DIVINE MERCY, OPTIONAL VISIT TO THE SALT MINE

Today we will visit the Divine Mercy centre in Lagiewniki and the tomb of the Apostle of Divine Mercy, St Faustina, in the old convent. We will view early depictions of the Divine Mercy image. Mass. Lunch (included) in the sanctuary hotel. After reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet, return to hotel. Later, there will be an optional visit to the Salt Mine at Wieliczka (cost will depend on numbers). During the tour, see statues sculpted in salt, as well as an underground church furnished completely in items made of salt.

Day Four, Tuesday

BIRTHPLACE OF JOHN PAUL II, THE SHRINE OF KALWARIA

After breakfast we will visit Wadowice - the town where John Paul II was born. We will visit his parish church and see the baptismal font in which he was baptised. A chapel dedicated to the pope contains a vial of his blood. Mass. Next door is the family home of John Paul. This has now been transformed into an entertaining museum that tells the life story of this great saint. Continue to Kalwaria Zebrzydowska, a UNESCO World Heritage site known as the "Polish Jerusalem" which has 42 chapels commemorating the Passion of Christ and the life of the Blessed Virgin. Dinner in hotel.

Day Five, Wednesday

CZESTOCHOWA

Day trip to the Jasna Góra Monastery at Czestochowa, Poland's most important Marian shrine. Czestochowa is the spiritual capital of Poland and has been a symbol of national resilience during the Nazi occupation, communism, and other dark periods in the nation's history. Mass and veneration of the miraculous Black Madonna icon. Free time for lunch and personal prayer. Return to hotel for dinner.

Day Six, Thursday

AUSCHWITZ-BIRKENAU CONCENTRATION CAMP, THE CARMELITE CHURCH

Morning visit to the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial, the site of one of the largest extermination camps for European Jews. The tour by excellent local guides will include a visit to the cell where St. Maximilian Kolbe died. Tour and cost of obligatory headphones included. Lunch (included) in a Catholic institution in the nearby town. Return to the hotel. Rest. Mass in the Carmelite Church which contains the revered Madonna of Krakow, where Jan Sobieski prayed before his victory in the Battle of Vienna.

Day Seven, Friday

TRANSFER TO KRAKOW AIRPORT AND FLIGHT TO DUBLIN

Check-out of hotel. Transfer to Krakow airport for our flight back to Dublin (final flight times will be confirmed a few weeks before departure).
